


Connect the Power


1. Plug one end of the AC Adapter into the DC 13V In jack on the back of your H/O 100/200 phone



2. Wrap the power cord around the strain relief notch in the base.




3. Plug the other end of the AC Adapter into your wall outlet.




Connecting the Phone Line

1. Plug one end of the telephone cord into the *Line* Jack on the back of your H/O 100/200 phone.




2. Plug the other end of the telephone cord into your wall jack.



Installing Additional Equipment

You can install additional equipment, such as an answering machine or messaging system, by connecting it to the *TEL* Jack on the back of your H/O 100/200 phone.

1. Plug one end of your telephone cord into the *TEL* Jack on the back of your H/O 100/200 phone.




2. Plug the other end of the telephone cord into the additional device, such as an answering machine.

Raise the Antenna

Raise the antenna to the vertical position.




Installing the Handset Battery Pack

1. Press in on the Battery Cover Release and slide the battery compartment cover down.



2. Align the plastic connector of the Nickel-Cadmium battery pack with its socket and plug it in.

Note: The black lead will be on the right when the plug is properly aligned.



- 3. Place the battery pack inside the battery compartment, and slide the battery cover back on.
- Note: The built-in Memory Backup feature allows up to 3 minutes to disconnect the old battery pack and install a new one without losing any numbers stored in memory. For optimum battery performance, please charge the battery overnight before using the system.





Charging the Handset

Place the handset on the base to charge. The Charge message appears on the LCD. See page 17 for details.

Note: The handset must be fully charged before the phone will operate properly. The battery included with your phone is not charged. Allow 12 to 15 hours for the Handset to charge.

During this time you can use the speaker phone to make calls.

Battery Memory Effect


Rechargeable batteries can develop a "memory" (reduced charge capacity) caused by repeated charge and discharge cycles. The battery life will seem to be shorter over time as you use the unit.

To Avoid Memory Effect

At least once a month, operate the unit until the "Battery Low" indicator appears. Avoid "topping off" the charge after using the phone for a short time. Also, do not charge the Rechargeable Battery for extended periods of time.

Low Battery Indicator

When the Battery Pack in the Handset is low and needs to be charged, the *talk/batt low* LED flashes every 3 seconds.




If this occurs while you are on the phone, you hear an alert tone. Complete your call as quickly as possible, and return the Handset to the Base Unit for charging.

Allow 12 to 15 hours without any interruption for the Handset to fully recharge.

Cleaning the Battery Contacts


To maintain a good charge, it is important to clean all battery contacts on the Handset and Base Unit about once a month. Use a pencil eraser or other contact cleaner. Do not use any liquids or solvents.





When you first turn on the Home Organizer, a diagnostic is performed. During the diagnostic, which lasts around 15 seconds, the screen will be blank.







The LCD Screen

The Home screen can be reached at any time by pressing the Function Key under the $\operatorname{reached}$ icon.






Your H/O 100/200 phone is divided into several functional areas. These are:


Arrow and Select Keys

These keys are used to move the cursor on the screen, or to select a feature.



Function Keys


The Function Keys are associated with the icons on the LCD screen directly above them. To select an operation represented by an icon on the LCD screen, press the Function Key below the icon.






The Base Unit Keypad

Setting up the Phone

This section explains how to set up the phone features of your H/O 100/200 phone. The features include setting the Speaker volume, entering your local area code and prefix, turning off the LCD screen, and paging the Handset.

Entering the Local Area Code and Prefix

- 1. Press the Function Key under $\underset{\text{setup}}{\times}$
- 2. Press the Function Key under (phone)
- 3. Enter a dial prefix, if necessary, and press *return* on the keyboard. For example, enter the number 9 if you are required to dial 9 for an outside line.
- 4. Enter your local area code. For example, 817.
- 5. If your area has multiple area codes, but calling within these area codes is a local call, enter those numbers in "Local Area Codes" to keep the unit from automatically dialing the area codes
- 6. Press the Function Key under (done) to save the information.

Press the Function Key under

Setting the Time

Note: If you have Caller ID service from your local phone company, the time and date will be set automatically when you receive your first call.

- 1. Press the Function Key under setup
- 2. Press the Function Key under (more)
- 3. Press the Function Key under (time)
- 4. Use $\mathbf{\nabla}$ or \mathbf{A} to select the hour.

— OR —

Type the hour in with the number keys on the keyboard.

- 5. Press \blacktriangleright to move to minutes.
- 6. Use $\mathbf{\nabla}$ or $\mathbf{\wedge}$ to select minute.

— OR —

Type the minute in with the number keys on the keyboard.

- 7. Press ▶ to move to am/pm.
- 8. Use $\mathbf{\nabla}$ or \mathbf{A} to select am or pm.

— OR —

Type a for am, or p for pm on the keyboard.

- 9. Press \blacktriangleright on the keyboard to advance to the date.
- 10. Use $\mathbf{\nabla}$ or $\mathbf{\wedge} \mathbf{\triangleleft}$ or $\mathbf{\triangleright}$ to select the month.
- 11. Press \blacktriangleright to move to the day.
- 12. Use $\mathbf{\nabla}$ or \mathbf{A} to select the day.
- 13. Press ▶ to move to the year.
- 14. Use \blacksquare or \blacktriangle to select the year.
- 15. Press ▶ on the keyboard to advance to daylight saving.
- 16. Use ▼ or ▲ to select daylight savings time. Selecting "yes" will enable your unit to automatically sense the change to Daylight Savings Time.
- 17. Use ► to move to the time zone.
- 18. Use ▼ or ▲ to select the time zone.
 For example: Select CST/-0600 for Central Standard Time.
- 19. Press the Function Key under (done)
- 20. To cancel, press the Function Key under $\prod_{i=1}^{m}$.

Setting the Ringer Level

- 1. From the Setup Phone Screen press (tab) until the cursor is on Ringer Level.
- 2. Use the left or right arrow keys to toggle between off, low, and high.
- 3. Press (t_{ab}) on the keyboard.
- 4. Press the Function Key under (done) to save the information.

Key Feedback

This option gives you the choice of turning the sound on or off when pressing the keys on the base.

- 1. From the Setup Phone Screen press (tab) until the cursor is on Key Feedback.
- 2. Use the left or right arrow keys to toggle between on and off.
- 3. Press the Function Key under (done) to save the information.

Turn the LCD Display Off

Use this feature to turn the LCD backlight off.

Note: The LCD backlight automatically turns off after ten minutes if you are not using the H/O 100/200.

- 1. Press the Function Key under setup
- 2. Press the Function Key under (phone).
- 3. Press the Function Key under (sleep)

Setting the Speaker Volume

- 1. Press (speaker) on the Base.
- 2. Use the Volume Key (to adjust the speaker volume to a comfortable level.

Exiting Phone Setup

To exit the Phone Setup Screen, press the Function Key under

Setting Up Permanent Notes

- 1. Press the Function Key under $\underbrace{\times}_{\text{setup}}$
- 2. Press the Function Key under (notes).
- 3. Use \checkmark or \blacktriangle \triangleleft or \triangleright to select the date.
- 4. Press (select) on the base.
- 5. Enter the note.
- 6. Press the Function Key under (done)

Permanent notes will be highlighted on the calendar.

Clearing Permanent Notes

Note: This clears all permanent notes on the day selected.

- 1. Press the Function Key under setup
- 2. Press the Function Key under (notes)
- 3. Use $\mathbf{\nabla}$ or $\mathbf{A} \mathbf{\triangleleft}$ or $\mathbf{\triangleright}$ to select the date.
- 4. Press the Function Key under (clear)
- 5. Repeat for other dates.
- 6. Press the Function Key under (done)

Restarting the System

You can restart the H/O 100/200 phone anytime by pressing shift + tab + del at the same time.

Entering notes

You can store up to seven lines of notes for each date on the calendar. Each line contains about 20 characters. The calendar changes each day and the notes for that day are automatically displayed.

Note: Temporary notes are only active for 60 days after they are entered.

- 1. Press $\mathbf{\nabla}, \mathbf{\Delta}, \mathbf{\triangleleft}, \mathbf{or} \mathbf{\triangleright}$ to move to the desired date on the calendar.
- 2. Press select
- 3. Type in the note.
- If you need to modify your note, press ▼, ▲, ⊲, or ► to move through your note and modify text.
- 5. Press del on the Base to backspace and erase text.
- 6. Press return on the Base.
- 7. Repeat for multiple notes
- 8. Press the Function Key under (done) when finished.







5. Press the Function Key under \square when done.

Dialing From the Caller ID Menu

Note: If the area code is the same as yours, or it's entered in "Local Area, Codes," the phone will not dial the area code, only the last seven digits.

- 1. Press the Function Key under $\mathbf{P}_{\mathbb{D}}^{\text{call}}$.
- 2. Press $\mathbf{\nabla}$ or \mathbf{A} to highlight the desired call.
- Pick up the handset (H/O 100), or pick up the handset and press the *talk* key (H/O 200).

Using Your Phone

Receiving Calls

1. After the second ring Caller ID information is displayed.

To remove the window immediately, Press any key on the keyboard.

The window closes automatically after 2 minutes.

If the Handset is away from the base press talk. (H/O 200 only)

- OR -Press (speaker). (H/O 100 and H/O 200)

Note: All screen functions are still available during your conversation. For example, you can type a note while talking on the phone.

Making Calls

Pick up the Handset and dial the number on the base keypad.

— OR —

Pick up the Handset, press the *talk* key and dial the number. (H/O 200)

— OR —

Press the speaker key on the base unit and dial the number on the base keypad. (H/O 200)

Storing Memory Numbers (H/O 200)

Up to 10 numbers can be stored in the H/0 200 Handset for speed dialing when you are away from the base. *Numbers cannot be stored in the Base unit.*

- Note: These numbers will not be stored in the Address Book automatically. You need to enter Address Book numbers separately.
- 1. Pick up the Handset and press *mem*. You will hear a beep and the *talk/batt low* LED flashes.
- 2. Enter the number you want to store on the Handset keypad.
- Note: You may enter a delay between numbers (for accessing a switchboard, or long distance service) by pressing the redial/pause button on the Handset at the point in the number sequence you wish to pause. The redial/pause button counts as one digit. Pressing redial/pause more than once will increase the length of the pause between numbers.
- 3. Press mem. You will hear another confirmation beep.
- 4. Enter a number (0-9) from the Handset keypad for the memory location.
- Note: After pressing mem the second time, you have 20 seconds to enter the number you wish to store. Otherwise, an error tone will sound and the unit returns to Standby.

Erasing a Stored Number (H/O 200)

- 1. On the Handset, press mem twice.
- 2. Enter the memory location number (0-9) you want to clear. You will hear a long beep confirming the number is erased.

Dialing Memory Numbers (H/O 200)

- 1. Press the *talk* key on the Handset.
- 2. Press the mem key on the Handset.
- 3. Enter the Memory Location Number (0-9).

Chain Dialing (H/O 200)

- 1. Press the *talk* key on the Handset.
- 2. Press the *mem* key on the Handset.
- 3. Enter the Memory Location Number (0-9)

4. While on call, enter the number from the Handset

— OR —

Enter the memory location number where the second number is stored.

Redialing the last Number Called (H/O 200)

- 1. Press talk.
- 2. Press the redial/pause key on the Handset.
- 3. The last number you called is dialed.

Using Your Phone With Call Waiting (H/O 100 and H/O 200)

Note: You must subscribe to call waiting service from your local phone company to use this feature.

- 1. While talking, you hear the call waiting signal.
- 2. Press *flash* on the Handset to switch to that call or press the switch-hook.
- 3. To switch back to your original call, press *flash* on the Handset, or press the switch-hook on the base again.

Paging the Handset (H/O 200)

- 1. Press the Function Key under setup.
- 2. Press the Function Key under (phone).
- 3. Press the Function Key under (page)

Changing Channels (H/O 200)

Note: If you have more than one cordless phone in your house, they must be set to different channels. This function works only when the phone is in use.

The *channel* key on the Handset allows you to choose among 40 factory set channels. During the course of a conversation if you hear static or noise causing difficulty in hearing the other party, change channels by:

- 1. Pressing the *channel* key on the Handset.
- 2. The talk/batt low LED on the Handset will flash, indicating the H/O 200 is finding the best channel available.

Changing the Handset Ring Type and Ring Volume (H/O 200)

There are 2 ring types and two ring volumes that can be selected while your H/O 200 is in the Standby mode. Be sure the talk/batt low LED is not lit on your H/O 200 Handset.

1. Press the *volume/ringer* key on the Handset to change between the 2 different rings and volumes.

Changing the Handset Earpiece Volume (H/O 200)

- 1. While on a phone call, press the *volume/ringer* key on the Handset.
- 2. You will hear a tone indicating a decrease in the earpiece volume.
- 3. Press the *volume/ringer* key again to increase the earpiece volume to the higher level.
